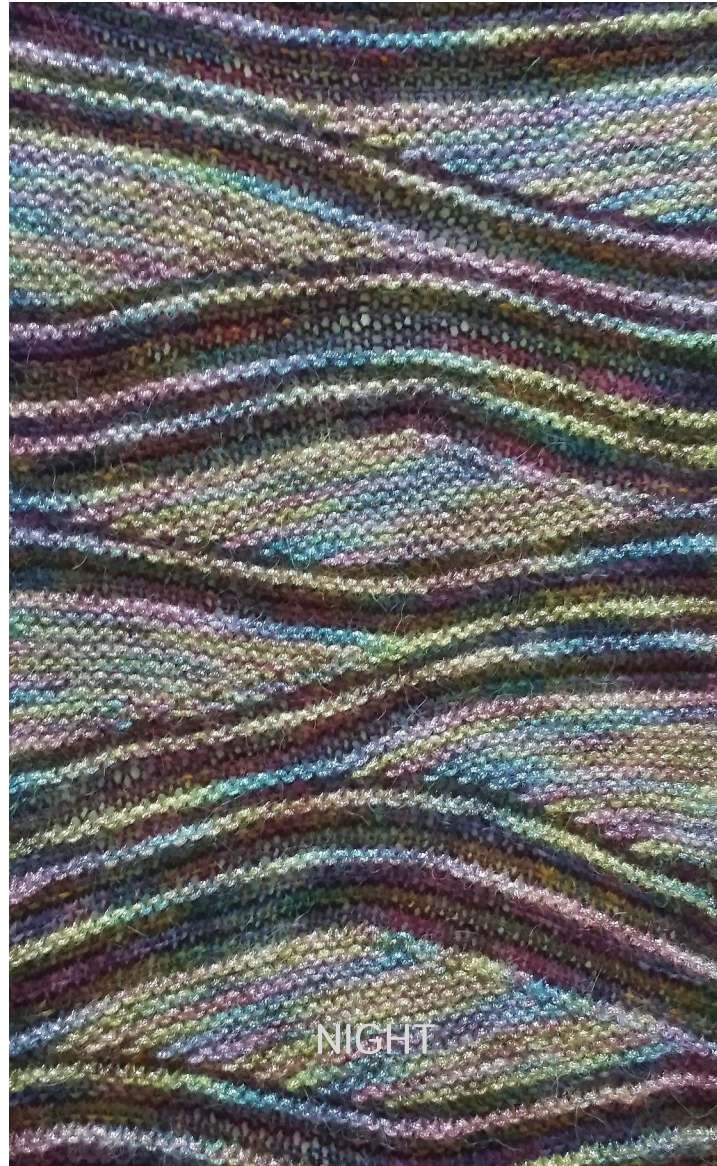

## MISS GRACE SCARF

**KNITTING KIT**  
using two different yarns  
total of 570 yards  
**Worsted Weight**

Yarn 1 : FINE MERINO  
270 yards  
100% Fine Merino  
4 oz. skein

Yarn 4 : VENICE  
300 yards  
50% Baby Alpaca  
22% Nylon  
21% Polyester (Lurex)  
7% Merino  
4 oz. skein

Needle size # 10 (6 mm)  
14 Stitches per 4 inches (10 cm)  
In Garter Stitch

SIZE  
14 X 56 inches

## PATTERN MISS GRACE

*Work with the VENICE yarn:*

**HFL** - Half Form Left (11 GSTR)

**HFR** - Half Form Right (11 GSTR)

**FF** - Full Form Venice (12 GSTR)

**L** - Line (1 GSTR)

*Work with the BASE yarn:*

**1 (2,3,4,5)** - Number of GSTR

**GSTR** - Garter Stitch Ridge = 2 knitted rows  
**SLWSL** - slip 1 stitch knit wise, bring yarn to the front, slip this stitch back onto the left needle (this stitch is being wrapped at the end

### *Pattern for the Half Form Right*

First front row: K7, SLWSL  
 Front rows 2, 3, 4 ... 10: knit 9, 11, 13 ... 25 stitches, SLWSL

All back rows: knit to the last stitch,  
 slip the last stitch knit wise  
 Front row 11: knit to the last stitch,  
 slip the last stitch knit wise  
 Last back row: knit to the last stitch,  
 slip the last stitch knit wise

### *Pattern for the Half Form Left*

First front row: knit to the last stitch,  
 slip the last stitch knit wise  
 First back row: knit 7 stitches, SLWSL  
 Back rows 2, 3, 4 ... 10: knit 9, 11, 13 ... 25 stitches, SLWSL  
 All front rows: knit to the last stitch,  
 slip the last stitch knit wise

### *Pattern for the Full Form*

First front row: knit 25 stitches, SLWSL  
 First back row: knit 20 stitches, SLWSL  
 Front rows 2, 3, 4 ... 11: knit 22 stitches, SLWSL  
 Back rows 2, 3, 4 ... 11: knit 20 stitches, SLWSL  
 Front row 12: knit to the last stitch,  
 slip the last stitch knit wise

### *Pattern for the L Rows*

Front row: knit to the last stitch,  
 slip the last stitch knit wise  
 Back row: knit to the last stitch,  
 slip the last stitch knit wise

### *Pattern for the Base Rows*

Front rows: knit to the last stitch,  
 slip the last stitch knit wise  
 Back rows: knit to the last stitch,  
 slip the last stitch knit wise  
 NOTE: Follow the numbers of the GSTR

After finishing your scarf keep working both ends with the

Last

### *How to use all yarn up for a maximum size*

You will need to cast on 50 stitches with your US size 10 (6 mm) needles and as the chart shows, do this with scrap yarn as a provisional cast on. Knit the first GSTR with the base yarn and then follow the chart and knit to the last GSTR in the base yarn. All the yarn you have left divide in two equal portions. After unraveling the provisional cast on you can pick up these stitches again to work "backwards".

This way, both ends will look the same and you will have a nice bind off edge. (The chart shows a possible striping.)

### *Carrying the unused yarn on the side*

You will need to carry the yarn you are putting on hold on the side. There is no need to cut the yarn. The left edge is completely easy, because the GSTR are done with two rows and will look perfect. The right edge should look the same. Therefore you have to find the right way to switch the two yarns. One ridge to the next is easy, but if you have to carry the yarn for 2 or more GSTR you need to weave the yarn in at the edge. Here is a good way to do this:

At the beginning of the row knit the first stitch, then move the unused yarn from the back between the first and the second stitch to the front and keep knitting. For the next front row you bring the unused yarn from the front to the back between the first and the second stitch. And so on.

**SHAPING:** Wash your scarf by hand and on high spin in the washer. For the final air drying lay the scarf flat on a towel (bed) and stretch for a perfect shape. Pressing will flatten the scarf and it will take the fluffiness away.

Provisional cast on with scrap yarn

After finishing your scarf unravel the provisional cast on, pick up the 50 stitches and keep working both ends with the leftover yarn.
