1 skein **PARMA #1**
80% MERINO / 20% SILK
275 Yards / 3.5 oz.

1 skein **PISA #2**
36% KID MOHAIR
61% MERINO / 3% NYLON
300 Yards / 3.5oz.

1 skein **GLITTER #3**
91% FINE MERINO WOOL
9% LUREX
300 Yards / 3.5 oz.

1 skein **BIELLA #4**
60% NYLON
40% KID MOHAIR
270 Yards / 3.5 oz.

1 skein **FANTASIA #5**
50% FINE MERINO WOOL
50% NYLON
155 Yards / 2 oz.

GAUGE:
20 Stitches and 28 Rows
= 4 x 4 inches (10x10 cm)
in Garter Stitch
on US # 7- 8 circular needle
(4.5 - 5 mm) 24 inches long (60 cm)

ARABELLA SWIRL SHAWL PATTERN

Materials: 5 skein Knitting Kit from SKEINO
US 7-8, 24" circular knitting needle

Gauge: 20 sts and 38 rows = 4" square in Garter Stitch.

Note: The shawl is knitted lengthwise, using short rows to shape the sections. Start with section one and knit all the way to the end of section nine. The tail from your cast on is at the neck edge.

Yarn sequence

Sections 1 and 6 are knitted with skein #1 (PARMA)
Sections 2 and 7 are knitted with skein #2 (PISA)
Sections 3 and 8 are knitted with skein #3 (GLITTER)
Sections 4 and 9 are knitted with skein #4 (BIELLA)
Section 5 is knitted with skein #5 (FANTASIA)
Yarns 1 to 4 are being used twice and yarn 5 once.

Abbreviations

k2tog - knit two stitches together (one stitch decrease)
YO - yarn over (one stitch increase)

Wrap & Turn (w&t):

- knit up to the stitch to be wrapped
- pull the working yarn forward between the two needles
- slip stitch from left needle to right
- pull the working yarn back between the two needles
- slip the same stitch from the right needle to the left needle
- turn work
- pull the working yarn back between the two needles to be in position to continue knitting

Directions

With yarn #1 cast on 132 stitches and knit 1 row.

Triangle repeat

Row 1: Knit 128 stitches, w&t
Row 2: Knit to the end
Row 3: Knit 124 stitches, w&t
Row 4: Knit to the end
Row 5: Knit 120 stitches, w&t
Row 6: Knit to the end
Row 7: Knit 116 stitches, w&t
Row 8: Knit to the end

Continue in this manner, knitting 4 stitches fewer every odd-numbered row, and knitting to the end of every even-numbered row.
The last w&t is 4 stitches from the end.

Lace Row:

(last row in yarn #1) - knitting from the wide end towards the narrow end: Slip 1, knit 1, *YO, k2tog*, repeat between *and * to the last two stitches, knit 2.

CHANGE TO YARN #2

Attach the new yarn at the narrow end. Knit across the row and at the end of the row use the backwards-loop-cast-on to cast-on 16 stitches. Turn your work and begin the Triangle Repeat at Row 1. (128 stitches = NOT to the end, it will be 16 stitches before the end).

Repeat the Triangle Repeat until you have finished all 9 triangles. Each triangle starts with 128 stitches and you will have from each triangle 16 stitches left on the narrow side.

Finishing

The last row from the ninth triangle is the lace row. You will have on your needle: last triangle = 128 stitches and from triangle 1 to 8 = eight times 16 stitches = 128 stitches, for a total of 256 stitches. Knit the last lace row all the way across (256 stitches) with the last yarn used. Using your leftover yarn to add as many rows and textures as you wish. This will give your shawl a wonderful edge. Bind off all stitches loosely.

Optional:

Using size F crochet hook work a single crochet around the entire shawl. Sew in the ends.
