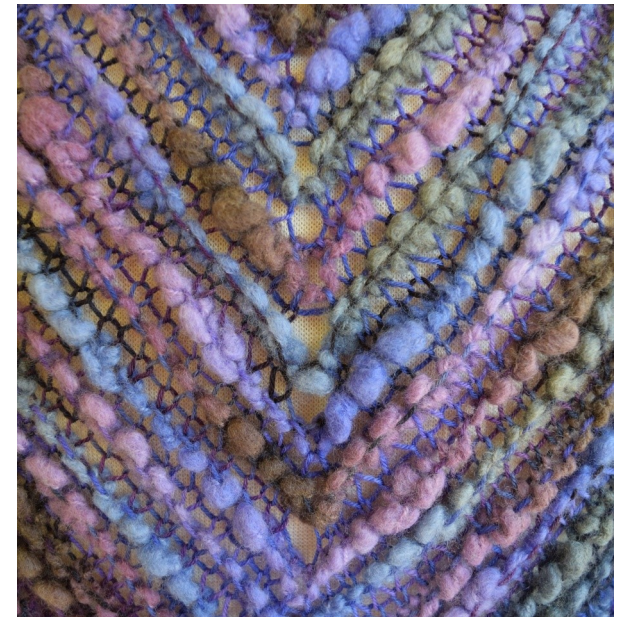

**FLAME** Yarn  
and our Sock Yarn  
**MERINO-NYLON**

Flame 100% Extra Fine Merino  
Super Bulky - Weight  
Double skeins 7 oz. (200 grams)  
200 yards

Merino Nylon Sock Yarn  
4 oz. (114 grams) 435 yards

**GAUGE:**  
12 stitches and 24 rows  
in Pattern Stitch  
= 4" (10 x 10 cm) square.  
on # 10 (6 mm) circular Needle  
24 inches long

**FINISHED SIZE**  
34 X 68 inches (86 x 173 cm)



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## Denali Shawl

This pattern is designed by Bjorn Coordt.

This triangle shawl is knitted from the top down and uses two different yarns in very different weights.

One skein is the **FLAME** yarn, a thick and thin spun super bulky weight yarn and the other one is our **MERINO - NYLON** sock yarn.

### Needle

US # 10 (6 mm) circular 32-40 inches long

### Gauge

12 stitches / 24 rows = 4x4 inches (10x10 cm)

### Abbreviation

**K** - knit

**P** - purl

**SL** - slip

**F** - Flame yarn

**S** - Sock yarn

**KB** - knit bar below (increased one stitch)

**(K-YO-K)** - knit, yarn over, knit in the same stitch  
(increase 2 stitches)

**Slide** - slide needle to the side where the yarn is

### Note

The shawl is knitted top down and every other row you need to increase 4 stitches:

after the second stitch KB (increase 1 st) and the center stitch (K-YO-K) increase 2 stitches.

## PATTERN

Cast on with F 3 sts

1. row F: SL1, (K-YO-K), K1
2. row F: K5
3. row S: SL1, (K-YO-K) 3 times, K1
4. row S: K11
5. row F: K2, KB, K3, (K-YO-K), K3, KB, K2
6. row S: K2, P13, K2
7. row S: K2, KB, K5, (K-YO-K), K5, KB, K2 - Slide
8. row F: K19
9. row S: K2, KB, K7, (K-YO-K), K7, KB, K2
10. row S: K23
11. row F: K2, KB, K9, (K-YO-K), K9, KB, K2 - Slide
12. row S: P27
13. row S: K2, KB, K11, (K-YO-K), K11, KB, K2
14. row F: K31
15. row S: K2, KB, K13, (K-YO-K), K13, KB, K2
16. row S: K35
17. row F: K2, KB, K15, (K-YO-K), K15, KB, K2
18. row S: P39
19. row S: K2, KB, K17, (K-YO-K), K17, KB, K2 - Slide
20. row F: K43

Continue following this sequence to grow your shawl.

Work until you have the Flame yarn knitted up, but keep enough yarn to bind off loosely with the Flame yarn by using a size 11 needle.

Use the leftover Sock Yarn double stranded to crochet along the edge (shoulder line) to make it strong for the wear.

Weave in all ends.

Your DENALI SHAWL is ready.

***The shawl is named in honor of the Denali National Park in Alaska.***
